The next East Community Winter gathering will be held, **January 25, 2020 at Faison Presbyterian Church, 502 West Main St., Faison, NC 28341**. Directions are included in this packet.

The East Steering Team has been working enthusiastically to plan for this East Gathering and is particularly excited about hosting Rev. Floretta Barbee-Watkins, Pastor of The Avenue Presbyterian Church of Charlotte, NC and a Board Member of the Presbyterian Mission Agency as she comes to share about our PCUSA Mission Agency "Matthew 25 Initiative." There are options:

- Take the Faison exit 355 (NC-403). Follow NC-403 N into Faison (becomes Main St). The church is on the left.
- Take either of the Warsaw exits (369 or 364) to Hwy 117 N. Follow Hwy 117 into Faison. Turn left at the light onto Main St. The church is on the right.

From points east take NC-24 west:

Take 24 W to Kenansville. Take Hwy 50 W to Warsaw. Turn right onto Hwy 117. Follow Hwy 117 into Faison. Turn left at the traffic light onto Main St. (NC-403). The church in on the right. **Other routes from Kenansville will also lead you to Hwy 117. Turn right onto Hwy 117.

Presbytery of Coastal Carolina East Steering Team Report January 25, 2020

The East Community Steering Team has met regularly since the June 2019 Gathering, and has worked faithfully to offer events for the East Community and to plan for East Gatherings.

The June Gathering featured Rev. Joan Gray, author of *Sailboat Church* and *Spiritual Leadership for Church Officers*. She also led a workshop and preached in worship. A variety of other workshops were also offered. Approximately 80% of East Community churches completed sessional record review. Dates and locations for 2019 review sessions will be announced soon. A Strategic Communications worship, led by a team from GA Mission Agency, was well attended in September. Officer training in November was held at Camp Kirkwood with excellent leadership and a large attendance. Shared Mission funds were granted to Camp Kirkwood and to the Community Counseling Center to benefit these ministries. Training event funds were granted to Presbytery's youth program to assist East Community students attending the Montreat College Conference.

Presbytery Youth Ministry

Our Presbytery Youth Council (PYC) hosted their first events, exploring the year's theme: "Faith For the Win."

Senior High Retreat @ Camp Kirkwood.

November 16 - November 17. The theme was "Slow and Steady Wins the Race."

Rev. Becky Durham of Peace Presbyterian Church provided materials for our Youth Council to lead activities, discussion, and small groups of students. Together, youth and leaders from 15 different churches looked to Paul & Timothy, to see how they "ran their race." Looking at their example, we are reminded to "Correct,



Confront, Encourage", "Practice self-control", "Endure suffering for the sake of the Gospel", "Preach the good news", "Serve until the end".

Along with canoes & zipline, the event included a trivia & movie night. We also offered fun opportunities to test ourselves following Sunday worship - Camp Kirkwood's "Swing by Choice" and the new "Power Pole."

Adults <u>also</u> had their own opportunity for retreat and learning this year as we gathered to study the Enneagram. The Enneagram is a model for understanding personality and spiritual motivation. With the leadership of Jenny Lee, Director of Youth & Christian Education (First Presbyterian, Sanford), we explored the ways our Enneagram types connect with our spiritual life and leadership.

College Conference @ Montreat. Thursday, January 2 – Sunday, January 5. Theme: "Remembering Sabbath." Our Coastal Carolina college students joined 1,000 Presbyterian college students to focus on Sabbath. Highlights included a presentation from Rev. Jimmie Hawkins of the PC(USA) Office of Public Witness and workshops ranging in topics from selfcare and mental health, contemporary poetry surrounding Sabbath, and incorporating theology into our favorite movies.

What is the YOUTH COUNCIL? The Presbytery Youth Council (PYC) is a group of high school students, who plan and implement Presbytery-wide events for middle and high school youth. This council should reflect the diversity, creativity, and dedication of our Presbytery and communities.

Requirements:

- Rising 9th-12th grader
- Active member of a Presbyterian church in the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina
- Regular participation in planning meetings and events
- Willingness to learn new skills and eventually provide leadership

The PYC is challenging and will make demands on busy schedules, but the experience is very rewarding. PYC members develop leadership and planning skills, experience unique events and opportunities, and make lasting friendships with other youth from around the Presbytery.

Agreeing to serve on the PYC, is a decision that should be made carefully. **The other members of the PYC need** to be able to count on you for regular attendance, support, and participation in meetings and events.

CONSIDER AS YOU APPLY:

- Each member is asked to serve a 2-year term. You may "renew" when the term is up or rotate off, if needed.
- All members should be present at Installation during the October Presbytery meeting
- Members are asked to be present at retreats. They should expect to participate in planning prior to events.
- If elected, you initially make a 1-2 year commitment of time & talents to our Presbytery
- If elected, you serve as a role model for others. Your behavior, language, **social media presence**, and involvement in your church and presbytery should reflect positively on the PYC.

- PYC Planning & Training (Location TBD) -> THURSDAY, August 13 FRIDAY, August 14

- Middle School Retreat → March 19-21, 2021
