Thank you for registering for the West Community Gathering! Please help make this a productive and efficient meeting by following these guidelines.

1. Prepare & Practice.

- a Have headphones or speakers, have a microphone, a webcam is optional.
- b Know how to turn the volume up/down so you can hear.
- Please be sure your version of the zoom program is Up-To-Date by going to https://zoom.us/download
 and downloading the latest version.
- d If you are unsure of Zoom, you can go anytime to <u>zoom.us/test</u> then click JOIN then click Join with Video. You can test your connection and your camera.
- e Be familiar with these tips and instructions
- 2. You can access the meeting by using the link in your registration confirmation email. This email has the **subject "West Community Gathering Zoom Link to Meeting"** it is from Laura Lupton.
- 3. You will have the best experience for the meeting if you join on a **desktop or laptop computer or tablet** with the following:
 - i. High speed internet access.
 - ii. Sound output device: speakers, headset, or earbuds.
 - iii. A microphone device.

• If joining by computer is not possible, a **tablet or smart phone** may be used, using the free Zoom app, available from the device's app store.

If absolutely necessary, participants may dial into the meeting using a **phone** if the above hardware is unavailable. However, visuals will not be available and voting for persons in the meeting by phone call only will be a challenge. The phone numbers are long distance. The following commands can be entered via tones using your phone's dial pad while in a Zoom meeting: *6 - Toggle mute/unmute yourself and *9 - Raise hand to be recognized to speak.

- 4. **If you have a "bad internet" day**, please connect by phone then continue trying to connect via computer. Once your computer connection is reestablished, hang up your phone connection to avoid feedback.
- 5. If you get dropped (disconnected) or freeze up, simply use the same link to rejoin the meeting.
- 6. The Zoom event will open at **9:10am**. You are encouraged to join early with your camera and microphone to be sure everything is working. The call to Order is 9:30AM
- 7. This meeting will be recorded and live streamed.

Using Zoom

In Zoom, you will see a control bar on your screen like one of these. If you do not see the control bar, move your mouse or tap your screen so that it will appear.



phone/tablet view

The following options will be available:

- a. Mute: The mute button toggles your microphone on and off. Once we move into the meeting portion, all microphones will be muted except when the moderator has recognized someone to speak. To activate your microphone when you have been recognized, press/click the mute button to unmute yourself. (If you have joined by phone, the mute function is controlled by pressing *6.)
- b. **Chat**: A button at screen bottom also toggles an interface with a scrolling chat feature. You can type in remarks into the chat publicly with everyone in the meeting or privately with an individual attendee. You can use this chat area to ask questions or make comments during the meeting.
- c. **Participants**: Click the Participants button to see a list of everyone who has joined the meeting. You can double-click a name on the list to begin a chat with them. Also, you will also

see arrows beside the various images. You can scroll left and right to see the other participants in the meeting.

- d. Raise Hand: The raise hand feature will be used for seeking recognition for speaking or to object to a motion being passed through unanimous consent.
 - i To raise your virtual hand, click the Participants button,
 - ii then press the "Raise Hand" button. A little blue hand icon will appear next to your image and on the participants list. (On phones, entering *9 activates the "raise hand" feature.)
 - iii on some MOBILE apps you find "Raise Hand" under the ... More option of the menu
- a **Voice on the Floor:** If at some point you wish to speak, press the "raise hand" button to indicate to the Moderator that you have something to say. The Moderator will recognize such individuals, send you a message to enable the mic, and then you will be un-muted temporarily to speak.
- b **Voting:** Most voting for this meeting will be by unanimous consent UNLESS there is objection. Such objections can be made through the raise hand function. If no one objects, the motion passes. If there IS an objection to the motion, a full vote will be taken through the polling function.
- c **Polling:** For some items, a poll question will appear on your screen and you will be asked to indicate yes or no or I'm not eligible to vote. If you are calling in on a phone, you may be asked to announce your vote, if the tally is close. Since the poll automatically counts the vote, the poll will be the final vote on a motion.

Some Suggestions to Make It a Better Meeting

- 1. **Be early**—get a good "view."
 - a. Be early, as it can take a couple of minutes to get connected. The Zoom meeting will open at 9:10AM, and the meeting will begin with a brief orientation at 9:30am.Please be patient if we are having technical challenges!
 - b. View: You can swap between speaker view and gallery view by choosing the appropriate control in the upper right. Once the meeting begins, you may wish to utilize the speaker view so that it is easier to follow the action of the meeting.
 - c. When there is screen sharing or videos showing, you may see a column of people. At the top of that column, you can choose to see only the person speaking.

2. Tips and etiquette

- a. Connect from a spot with a good Wi-Fi signal—or, even better, a wired connection via Ethernet cable.
- b. Check your background in your video we can see what is behind you.
- c. If you get the message about an "unstable internet connection," turning off your video might help you stay connected and hear better.
- d. Check how your name is displayed. You can "rename" it if it is not correct.
- e. Even before the meeting begins, **mute yourself** if you are not actively speaking.

- f. If you are in a noisy spot, use headphones to reduce background noise. NOTE If/When you speak we will hear ALL your background noise TV, telephone, dogs, fans, radio, etc. please be in a quite environment.
- g. Bring a beverage and snack with you when you join the meeting and go to the bathroom ahead of time so you don't have to step away.
- h. Once the meeting gets going, co-hosts will control mute.
- i. If you are joining by phone, you'll need to start with "This is <name>" so that people know who is speaking.

3. Troubleshooting & Assistance

- a. Unstable internet it may recover and reconnect if you get disconnected.
- b. Try joining the meeting by computer or tablet with your camera off to reduce bandwidth usage.
- c. Close all other open programs on your computer. Close open tabs on your web browser.
- d. Do not try to watch the YouTube or Facebook view of the meeting at the same time.

e. If you have issues and can't connect:

- 1. Start over.
 - a) Close all other open programs on your computer, then
 - b) open your email and click on the personalized link for the meeting.
 - c) Be patient for the Zoom window to open. -
 - d) if these steps did not work, follow the instructions to connect by phone only.
- 2. For this meeting we are not able to offer tech support. If you have trouble connecting into zoom, please watch the meeting in Facebook.
- 4. The breakout discussions will not be available in live stream, only in zoom.
