The Bible and Film



Dr. Sam Adams will lead participants in exploring the different ways in which Christianity, the Bible, and film can be placed into mutually enriching conversation. How can biblical texts provide new lenses for our viewing of films? In what ways can films enrich our understanding and interpretation of Scripture? Participants will engage a variety of topics and films in the process, including actual depictions of biblical stories, Christ figures in film, monsters, the Bible and American identity in film, religious satire, and themes related to the book of Job.

Dr. Adams is the Professor of OT and Director of Community Engagement at Union Presbyterian Seminary. As an ordained PCUSA minister he has served churches in New Haven, CT; Chicago, IL; and in Richmond, VA. He is the editor of the journal, *Interpretation*. He has published books on wisdom, death and the afterlife, and the socioeconomic world of the Bible. He is active in several community initiatives in Richmond.

Monday evening will feature a ***special music program*** by the very talented **Karla Casteen and Vera Simpson**. Karla is a graduate of UNC Chapel Hill, an educator and musician/vocalist, has conducted a variety of music groups, and is Music Director at Wallace PC. Vera has played for the retreat for several years, is a graduate of East Carolina University with a Bachelor of Music in Piano Pedagogy, is a frequently called upon accompanist, and is organist/pianist at Wallace PC. They have both sung at Carnegie Hall and Karla has rung bells on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial.

Trinity Center is a beautiful facility of the Episcopal Diocese of East Carolina situated on Bogue Banks between the ocean and the sound. It has motel-style rooms with one single and one double bed in each room, heat and AC, and a private bath. There are also adjacent living rooms.

The SMA Orientation, held virtually on January 30, 2023, welcomed new and returning commissioners and gave overviews of the structure, committees, and mission of the Synod. Your commissioners participated and have been assigned their Synod committees as noted above.

Synod Assembly Meetings

Both PCC synod commissioners participated in the hybrid 251st Synod of Mid-Atlantic Assembly was held March 10-11, 2023, at Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, VA (See attached summary of highlights). One of the Assembly's topics highlighted was Matthew 25 and poverty, included sharing activities within each Presbytery in response to the Matthew 25 Initiative. [Synod Commissioners were asked to report by March 3, 2023, how our churches/presbytery are doing God's reconciling work by engaging in the Matthew 25 Initiative. This event's theme, "When did we see you? Matthew 25:31-46", was the same that was planned for the 2022 Presbyterian Youth Triennium that was cancelled due to Covid. This event was open to everyone, particularly youth, even if the church didn't have an active youth group. Workshop leaders came from Fayetteville Technical Community College, a psychologist, and our own Presbytery Youth Council.

We encourage churches to sign up, and be recognized by the denomination, as Matthew 25 churches using the PMA link: Presbyterian Mission Agency Become a Matthew 25 church | Matthew 25 in the PC(USA): Join the Movement | Presbyterian Mission Agency. We will be actively assisting our churches in learning more about how they are Matthew 25 churches and how to be recognized at synod and denominational levels.

BILLS AND OVERTURES COMMITTEE
Report to Presbytery of Coastal Carolina
May 6, 2023

The members of the Coastal Carolina Presbytery Committee on Bills and Overtures met in January with General Presbyter/Stated Clerk Jerrod Lowry to review the Book of Constitutional Amendments, having already studied and worked to understand the 33 proposed amendments, the rationale for each one, and how each one would fit into or affect existing constitutional provisions. The following chart tracks each amendment in the order in which it appears in the constitution, identifies the topic, provides a brief description of the amendment, and indicates the committee's recommended action.

PLEASE NOTE: The proposed amendments were approved by the 222nd PC(USA) General Assembly and referred to the presbyteries for advice and consent. The presbyteries may not amend the proposed language. We may only give our response, either AFFIRMATIVE or NEGATIVE, to each one. Any of the proposed amendments may be lifted from this report for questions, discussion, and debate. **The Committee on Bills and Overtures MOVES the recommended actions on the amendments.**
